


DEVELOPMENT IN TRAFFIC TRENDS TO ILLEGAL SITES FROM 2016 TO 2017




Online crime is increasing!

The Content Theft and Malware Cycle



- Content theft site lures consumers with popular copyrighted content
- 2) Site supplements income (from advertising and/or subscriptions) by signing up to deliver malware for malware distribution network
- 3) Consumers surfing the content theft site are infected with malware








An important agreement Code of conduct with ISPs

Members of Teleindustrien agree

- All ISPs follow a court ruling against one ISP
- Based on notification from RA to ISPs
- Proces 7 working days
- Follow up when blocked addresses are modified / "mirror sites"
- Joint communication on blocked sites www.sharewithcare.dk
- ISPs keep track of blocked adresses www.teleindu.dk



INTRODUCTION OF DYNAMIC BLOCKINGS – LEGAL DEVELOPMENT

- District Court ruling of February 8, 2017
- Blocking injunctions focus on the infringing service, not the specific domains
- Courts accept that all (incl. future) domains providing access to an infringing service shall be blocked by ISPs
- Includes mirror sites, proxies and all future domains
- RA will inform the ISPs of additional domains and guaranty that they provide access to the initial infringing sites.
- Akin to UK developments e.g. the Premier League blocking case of March 8, 2017.







OVERVIEW OF LEGAL BASIS –

ART 83 mplemented into Danish legislation in 2002

No separate provisions implemented; Danish rules on preliminary injunctions already provided legal basis for blocking injunctions


Danish Administration of Justice Act para 413 requirements for injunctions:


- Relevant rightholders
- Injunction is the necessary remedy
- The urgency of activties requires action now and cannot await the traditional civil court system
